Mrs. Julia F. Killam, widow of Isaac Killam, passed away at her home in Pittsford Tuesday afternoon after a lingering illness. Mrs. Killam was 72 years of age and was the daughter of the late Lewis and Catherine Frost, for many years residents of this town.

Julia Frost was united in marriage to Isaac Killam January 20, 1864 and the early years of their married life were spent in the town of Greece. They moved to the Frost homestead farm many years ago and also resided for a time in this village. Over 60 years of Mrs. Killam's life were spent in the town of Victor.

After the death of her husband, which occurred some five years ago [in 1911], Mrs. Killam erected a new house in Pittsford and went there to live.

Two children survive: Miss Katherine J. Killam, who made her home with her mother, and Stephen J. Killam of this village, [and] five grandchildren: Mrs. Maude Killam Wilkinson, Miss Alice Killam, Louis M., Howard L. and David J. Killam, all of Victor.

The funeral services were held from the home of the deceased in Pittsford Thursday afternoon, the Rev. E. [Edwin] P. Wood of Albion and the Rev. G. [George] W. Scudder of Victor [both Universalists] officiating. Interment was made in Boughton Hill Cemetery.
