MRS. IDA KING DIES AT SIDNEY

Widely Known Resident Succumbs After Half Year of Failing Health

Mrs. Ida V. King, wife of Fayette King, died at the home, Riverside, Sunday morning at 5 o'clock. Mrs. King, who was 75 years of age, had been in failing health since last July and gravely ill for more than three weeks.

The funeral will be held at the home Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock. The Rev. F. [Frederick] G. Leonard, pastor of the Universalist church of Morris, will officiate. Burial will be in Evergreen cemetery in this village.

The survivors, besides the husband, are three daughters, Mrs. Kate G. Voegelin of Binghamton, Mrs. Claude B. Isbell of Rockwell's Mills and Miss Calla Louise King of Cobleskill; one son, Don C. King of Rahway, N.J.; two sisters, Mrs. Augustus Thomas of Mt. Upton and Mrs. Clara B. Hollis of Schenectady; one brother, Ulysses T. Greene of Sidney; nine grandchildren: Raymond K. Voegelin, Clayton B. Voegelin and Miss Gladys C. Voegelin, all of Binghamton; Clifford A. Isbell of Rockwell's Mills, Mrs. James Baron and Percy King of Rathway, N.J., and Miss Natalie Alice King of Woodcliff, N.J.; and one great-grandchild, Dorothy Voegelin of Binghamton.

Mrs. King was born in the town of Butternuts, Otsego county, the daughter of Edwin R. and Lucinda Greene, and most of her life was lived in Sidney or vicinity where by an exceptionally large number of friends and acquaintances she was held in high esteem and genuine affection. On Dec. 19 last, Mr. and Mrs. King celebrated the 55th anniversary of their marriage.
