Christopher Columbus Kingsbury was born in the town of Canton, St. Lawrence Co., N. Y., Feb. 11, 1829. When about 5 years of age, he moved with his people to the town of Norfolk. This town was his home for many years, or until 1890 when he moved onto a farm in Brookdale, residing there until 1902, when he moved to Brasher, living there with his daughter, Ethel, until his death on the afternoon of Wednesday, July 5th. Mr. Kingsbury married in 1852, Miss Mary L. Matthews. By this union he is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Martha Rogers, of Stockholm, and one son, Charles S. Kingsbury, of Ogdensburg. By a second marriage to Miss Rhoda Hemagin, of Massena, he is survived by one daughter, Ethel J. The deceased leaves two sisters, Mrs. Reed, of Raymondville, Mrs. Haywood, of North Stockholm, also three brothers, Darius, of Lawrence, Albert, of Winthrop, and Lathrop, of Muskegon, Mich. The funeral was held in W. M. Church, at Brookdale, Rev. F. [Fred] A. Line, of Winthrop [Universalist], officiating. Rev. Line was assisted by Rev. Wright, of Brookdale. Burial in Bixby cemetery.
