The funeral of Albert E. Kingsley, a former resident of this city, who died in Boston on Saturday, was held this morning at 11 o'clock from Cassidy's funeral parlors, 41 Genesee street, the Rev. Dana W. Bigelow, pastor of the Memorial Presbyterian Church, officiating. The interment was made in Forest Hill Cemetery.

Kingsley, and attended schools here, later becoming associated with his father in the clothing business which bore his name.
