Julia B. Kingsley

UTICA, Nov. 3.—Julia B., widow of Thomas L. Kingsley, died in her home, 82 Cornelia street, at 8 o'clock this morning. For the past five months she had been in poor health and had been confined to her bed nearly all that time. Death was due to old age and a general breaking down. Mrs. Kingsley was born in Lebanon, Conn., May 16, 1810. She came to Utica when she was a young girl, and was one of the oldest residents of this city. She married Thomas L. Kingsley in this city in 1839. He died in 1870. Mrs. Kingsley was an active member of the Church of the Reconciliation [Universalist] and in her younger days was one of its most ardent workers. She was also a member of the Ladies' Aid Society. When the Old Ladies' Home was first organized in this city, which was several years ago, Mrs. Kingsley was one of the board of managers, which office she held for a long time. She is survived by three sons, Charles C., Lewis H. and Albert E., of Utica; four daughters, Mrs. Mary L. Nye of Utica, Mrs. F. O. Manchester of New Haven, Conn., Mrs. George Cone and Mrs. John P. Vidyard of Chicago; also twelve grandchildren and ten great-grandchildren.
