DEATHS.

At Piketon, Pike county, Ohio, Mr. NATHANIEL KINGLSEY, aged 36 years. At the time of his death, Mr. Kingsley was engaged in fulfilling a heavy contract in which he was a partner, on the Cincinnati, Hillsborough & Parkersburg R. R. His decease was caused by a brief sickness of intermittent fever, and was, on account of the absence of his partners in the contract, who had but a few days previous left him in usual health, peculiarly afflictive to his companion [Sarah M. Kingsley] and brother, who were with him, as it was unexpected to many friends at a distance. His remains, in compliance with the wish often expressed by him during his sickness, were brought to his former residence, Rome, N.Y., for interment, and on the Sabbath succeeding his decease the funeral services were held at the Universalist Church in that village. A large number of friends and acquaintances were in attendance, to sympathize with the bereaved and to perform the last earthly duty to a citizen whom all respected. May the Church of which he was a member, the companion to whom he was recently united¹, the children² now orphaned, the brothers and sisters who suddenly sorrow, and all who feel bereaved by his loss, find abundant consolation in that faith which sufficed for him, and which is full of comfort for all who mourn.
