DIES FROM SHOCK SHE SUSTAINED ON FAIR GROUND MRS. ANDREW J. KINNE, 77 YEARS OF AGE AND NATIVE OF OXBOW, DIES.

Having never recovered from a stroke of paralysis, suffered on Wednesday, Sept. 8 at the fair grounds, during the session of the Jefferson county fair, Mrs. Amy A., wife of Andrew J. Kinne, aged 77 years, passed away early this morning at the residence of her son, George B. Kinne, in the Riverside Flats. While attending the fair Mrs. Kinne suffered a stroke of paralysis in one of the exhibition buildings. She was immediately taken to her son's home, where she had since been ill. After the shock her left side was partially paralyzed and her condition grew worse until her death early this morning.

She was born near Oxbow, Sept. 21, 1838, and spent her early life in the town of Antwerp. She was 77 years old just one week before she died. She is survived by her husband, four sons, Morris G. Kinne, Saskatchewan, Canada; George B., Giles W. and John Kinne, Watertown; four grandsons, Elmer, Detroit [and] Olsie, Robert and Ralph Kinne, Watertown; and three granddaughters, Mabel, Mildred and Gladys Kinne, all of this city.

The funeral services will be held from the son's residence, No. 41 Riverside Flats, Thursday morning at 11, with Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed, pastor of the All Souls' Universalist church, officiating. Interment will be made at North Watertown cemetery.
