EDUCATOR DIES AT FOURTH LAKE
Arthur C. Klock, High School Principal, Succumbs

Inlet, Aug. 22 (AP)—Arthur C. Klock, principal of a high school at New Haven, Conn., died of typhoid fever in a summer camp at Fourth Lake, Fulton chain, today. He was 54 years old and a graduate of St. Lawrence University.

Mr. Klock was principal of a junior high school at New Haven, Conn., but resided in West Haven, and when school closed in June he and his family went to Fourth Lake for the vacation period.

Mr. Klock was born on July 7, 1878, on the Klock homestead, at present occupied by [his brother] Kenneth Klock, on the Fincks Basin-Indian Castle highway, town of Danube. He was a son of the late Byron and Martha Christman Klock. He held positions at Canandaigua, East Aurora, and Latrobe, Pa., prior to going to New Haven 18 years ago. Mr. Klock was an attendant of the Universalist Church, and was president of the Sons of the Revolution at New Haven.

Surviving are his widow, who was formerly Elizabeth Griffin of Rochester; two daughters, Eleanor and Adelaide Klock of West Haven, and two brothers, Reuben Klock, near Little Falls, and Kenneth Klock, of the Fincks Basin-Indian Castle road.

The body was brought to the Newitt Funeral Home, from where it will be taken to the Reuben Klock residence. Arrangements for the funeral are not yet complete.
