HOWARD KNAPP, MOHAWK, DIES

Mohawk — Howard M. Knapp, 55, of 19 Walnut St., died yesterday in Memorial Hospital, Utica, after a short illness.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p.m. tomorrow from the Graves Funeral Home, with the Rev. Clinton A. Moulton, pastor of the Universalist Church, Dolgeville, officiating. Burial will be in the Mohawk Cemetery.

The American Legion will conduct full military honors at the cemetery and the Lodge of Odd Fellows will conduct a service at the funeral home.

Mr. Knapp was born in Dolgeville on Dec. 2, 1895, a son of Eugene J. and Edith Mortz Knapp. He married Ada M. Hill on Oct. 16, 1919, in Herkimer, with the Rev. Frank O. Hokerk officiating. He had resided in Mohawk for 36 years and was past commander of the Crowley-Barnum American Legion Post, and financial secretary of the IOOF and past noble grand. He also was a member of the Mohawk Fish and Game Club and the Business Men's Association.

He was a member of the Universalist Church, Dolgeville. Mr. Knapp was employed by the Leo Lawrence grocery store now operated by L. W. Wright, for 11 years. During World War I, he served in Europe for 18 months as a member of the 18th company, 3d Regiment Air Service Mechanics.

Besides his wife, he leaves four brothers, George, Mohawk; Olin and Floyd, Dolgeville, and Herman, Salisbury; three sisters, Mrs. W. I. Patterson, Washington; Mrs. David Spencer, Little Falls and Mrs. Robert Barlow, Gloversville, and several nieces and nephews.
