DEATH OF GEORGE W. KNIGHT

Webster, June 9—George W. Knight, an old resident of this village, died at his home in Main St., Friday night. He was born in this town November 2, 1833, a son of Nathaniel and Mary Robb Knight, pioneers of this town, who settled here in the year 1817. Mr. Knight was educated in Webster, and resided on the farm on which he was born on Phillips road until six years ago when he retired, since which time he has resided in the village. In 1862 he enlisted in Reynolds Battery and served several years in the war. He leaves one brother, James M. Knight; two nephews, George L. Knight, of Boise, Idaho, and Dayton R. Knight, of Auburn; one niece, Miss Mary G. Knight, of Webster. The funeral was held this afternoon at 2:30 from the house and was conducted by the Masonic fraternity. Rev. Donald Fraser officiated. Burial took place at Union cemetery, in Webster.
