JENNIE LAMPMAN EXPIRES AT AGE 100

NELLISTON—Mrs. Jennie Lampman, a long-time resident of Nelliston, died Saturday night at the age of 100 at the home of her granddaughter, Mrs. Mildred Brayman, Pittsburgh, Pa.

Mrs. Lampman, widow of Ulman Lampman, resided for more than 50 years in Nelliston and had lived in Pittsburgh about three years. She had been in ill health about two years.

Mrs. Lampman was born in the Town of Canajoharie on Dec. 6, 1858, a daughter of Theodore and Ellen Plank Farley. Her husband died in 1921.

She was a member of the Fort Plain Universalist Church.

Surviving are a son-in-law, Howard Lipe, Fort Plain; a daughter-in-law, Mrs. Ida Lampman, Pittsburgh; two grandchildren, Mrs. Brayman, with whom she resided, Mrs. Gertrude Mosher, Batavia; a brother, Thomas Farley, Fort Plain; eight great grandchildren and one great great-grandson.
