MRS. DION LAWRENCE.

Mrs. Cora Lawrence, wife of Dion Lawrence, passed away Friday afternoon of last week about 1 o'clock, at the home of her son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. William Cooke, on Grove street in Morris from the effects of a complication of diseases.

Cora E. Camp, daughter of Nelson and Ann (McIntire) Camp, was born March 28, 1862, in Morris, and in this township she spent the greater part of her life. [On] May 10, 1882 she married Dion Lawrence, a farmer, near Lower Dimmock Hollow. Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence spent a number of years on the Lawrence homestead. They resided for a time in Otego, Afton, Rockdale, and also in the state of Maryland.

Mrs. Lawrence was a consistent member of the Morris Universalist church; a devoted wife and a kind and indulgent mother. Throughout her long invalidism, she was most cheerful, never complaining and she leaves a host of friends who will cherish her memory.

The immediate surviving relatives are the husband, two daughters, Mrs. William Cooke and Mrs. Gordon Mudge of Morris; one son, Claud Lawrence, of Otego; two half-sisters, Mrs. Flora Bailey of Utica and Mrs. Melville Johnson of South New Berlin; seventeen grandchildren and seven great grandchildren, to all of whom much sympathy will be extended.

Funeral services, conducted by the Rev. F. [Frederick] G. Leonard, pastor of the Universalist church, were held from Sloan's Funeral parlors Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Interment was in the family plot in the old part of Hillington cemetery.
