WILLIAM LEWIS IS DEAD IN FALLS

Was Descendant of Early Settlers of Madison County

Little Falls—William B. Lewis, 78, died at 7 o'clock Monday night at the home of his daughter, Mrs. John I. Zoller, (25?) Diamond Street, after a long illness.

He was born in Solsville, Madison County, August 27, 1855, at the Lewis homestead. He was a descendant of the early settlers who came to that section from Connecticut in 1790.
