Charles Liddell Rites Are Held

Bristol—Funeral services were held at the Universalist church on Thursday afternoon for Charles Liddell, 85, who died at the Thompson hospital in Canandaigua on Tuesday, after an illness of a few months.

He was born in Scotland, Mar. 12, 1868 and came to the United States at the age of 17. He had resided in this and surrounding towns for more than 50 years, doing work on many farms in all sections putting tile drainage in many acres of land, which occupation he followed as long as his health permitted. He never married and had lived with many families during the years. The last three years he made his home with Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Childs on the Bristol Valley road, who were his true friends until the last. There are no near relatives.

He was a member of the Universalist church and a faithful attendant when possible, walking a long distance as that was his way of transportation.
