Obituary.

As we announced last week, David A. Lisk died at his home in this village on Wednesday, July 24th, at the age of 78 years. He was buried on his birthday, Friday, July 26th. The deceased was born in Cooperstown. He came to Clifton Springs nearly sixty years ago, and had resided here ever since. In his early days he took an active part in village and town affairs. He was one of the first postmasters of the village, and served as a Justice of the Peace of the town for twenty-four years. He was also an active temperance worker and was the first president of the Clifton Springs Christian Temperance Union. For a long term of years he was engaged in the hardware business, and later in the coal and lumber business. In the later years of his life he was engaged in manufacturing tinware, having secured several patents on anti-rusting tinware. The deceased is survived by three daughters, Miss Emma Lisk, of this village, Mrs. Stephen Mahoney, and Miss Kate Lisk, of Minneapolis, Minn., and one son, Sidney J. Lisk, of Elmira.

The funeral services were held at the house on Friday afternoon, the Rev. J. J. [Jay Jenkins] Brayton, a long time friend, officiating. The interment was made in the family lot in our village cemetery.
