MRS. HARRIET LOCK

Under the regular obituary head will be found a notice conveying intelligence of the death of another of the old settlers of Buffalo, in the person of Mrs. Harriet Lock, which occurred at her home in this city on Monday night. She had suffered from asthma the greater part of her life, the immediate cause of her death, however, being an attack of inflammation of the lungs. Deceased was born in the city of Chichester, Sussex county, England, on the 22d of November, 1806, and was therefore in the seventysecond year of her age. She was married March 6th, 1832 in the town of Fitchfield, Hampshire County, to Mr. John Lock, now one of the oldest builders in this city. The couple came to America the same year and took up their residence here on the 11th of May. She was a regular attendant at the Universalist Church and raised a family of seven children, of whom those surviving her are Charles H. Lock of New York, and William H., John E., James A. and Walter E. Lock of this city. Mrs. Lock was a lady of most estimable Christian character and was widely known for her kindliness of heart and affectionate nature.
