Sidney B. Lockwood

Sidney B. Lockwood, a former resident of the Eastern district for thirty years and for twenty years a resident of the Bedford section, died Sunday at his home, 1387 Dean street, where funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock, the Rev. Almon Gunnison, president of St. Lawrence University, assisted by the Rev. Cephas B. Lynn, acting pastor of All Souls Universalist Church, officiating. Mr. Lockwood, who was unmarried, was born in New York City, in February seventy-three years ago, and came with his parents, the late Jared J. and Rebecca Lockwood, to the Eastern District at an early age, living on Penn and Rodney streets during his residence there. He enlisted in the Fifth New York Cavalry for the Civil War and participated in many of its prominent battles. On his return he was with R. Hoe & Co., with A. T. Stewart & Co., and lastly with O. F. Hawley in the lumber business, retiring from active business about fifteen years ago. He was an attendant at All Souls Universalist Church and leaves a brother, Elisha S., and four sisters, Mary A. Lockwood, Amanda B. Lockwood, Mrs. C. F. Hartman and Mrs. O. F. Hawley.
