OLD RESIDENT OF BROWNVILLE PASSES AWAY
Miss Ida A. Lord, 69, Was Born and Had Always Lived in Brownville

Miss Ida A. Lord, 69, a member of one of the oldest families in the town of Brownville, died about 2:30 Friday afternoon at the home of her aunt, Mrs. Martha Wilcox, with whom she had resided for the past eight years.

Miss Lord suffered a shock [stroke] on October 12 and since that time she had been confined to her bed. For the past several weeks her condition had been very serious.

Miss Lord was born in the old Lord homestead in the village of Brownville. She was the daughter of Albert E. and Ann Austin Lord. Her father was for more than 30 years proprietor of a general store. He also served for a number of years as postmaster of the village. He died in 1900 and Miss Lord's mother died in 1915. The late Frank Austin, one of the founders of the Austin Nichols Co., one of the largest wholesale grocery concerns in the country, was a brother of Mrs. Lord's mother.

Following the death of her mother, Miss Lord went to the home of her aunt, Mrs. Martha Wilcox, to reside. She was an attendant at the Universalist Church at Dexter.

Funeral services will be held from the Wilcox home Monday afternoon at 2. Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed, D.D., pastor of the All Souls Universalist Church [in Watertown], will officiate. Burial will be made at the Brownville Cemetery.
