DIED.

Naham Lord died last Saturday at his home in Friendship, at the age of 65 years, and was buried at Mt. Hope Sunday, Rev. C. [Charles] Palmatier [Universalist] officiating. It is 25 years since Naham Lord, then a stalwart man, was attacked by rheumatism and disappeared from the ranks of his fellow bread-winners. For 16 years he was almost constantly confined to his room, and for the last 13 he was blind and as helpless as a paralytic. Here were infirmities enough to blast and wither a cheerful mind, but during all this long period Mr. Lord was uncomplaining and solicitous for the welfare and comfort of his wife, child and grand-children. Fortunately his mind was active, and a retentive memory joined with the ministrations of friends, enabled him to preserve an intelligent interest in the outside world's work and much relieve the tedium of unnatural confinement.

The floral offerings of relatives and friends were many and beautiful and a large concourse followed his remains to their final and desired rest.

Mr. Lord left a wife and one child, Mrs. Peleg [Josephine] Coon, who doubtless miss the presence of one who by his helplessness entered often into sympathetic hearts.

Mr. Lord was the youngest of ten children, of whom only four survive: Daniel Lord and Mrs. H. Kellogg, of Wirt; Mrs. Martin Scott, of Friendship and Mrs. Olive Langworthy, of Racine, Wisconsin.
