In Sheridan, Oct. 5, of typhus fever, after one week's illness, Mrs. CORRENIA LUSK, wife of J. W. P. Lusk, and daughter of Elisha Mayo, Esq., in her 28th year. It would not be easy to overrate the feeling of sadness which overspread the neighborhood of the deceased at the sudden calamity which her death was felt to be by persons of all faiths and classes. This was manifested in the very unusual number by whom her funeral was attended, and by the air of sorrowful concern, by which the assembly was marked. Mrs. Lusk was well known to be a decided Universalist, but this circumstance caused no abatement in the esteem and respect entertained toward her.... To know her was to esteem her, and to be apprised of her death was to deplore it.
