WILLIAM J. LUTTENTON

Following an accident in his home, William J. Luttenton of Albion was taken to the Arnold Gregory Hospital and his sudden death occurred on April 13. He was born in the town of Barre on May 30, 1880. He was a retired rural mail carrier, serving from 1901 to 1934. He was a loyal member of the Pullman Memorial Universalist Church with long service as choir director and superintendent of the church school. He was a Mason, a member of the Historical Society and the Rural Letter Carriers' Association. He was a versatile musician and delighted particularly in singing. The editor of the "Orleans American" in his column on April 15, stated that Mr. Luttenton "oozed with fellowship wherever he went." The Rev. J. Murray Gay, pastor, conducted the funeral service on April 15. Mr. Luttenton is survived by his brother, Hower w. Luttenton; two nieces, a great-niece and four nephews.
