Madison

Julius Madison, a highly respected colored resident of this village, died at his home on West Main street at about 3 o'clock Thursday morning. He was 58 years old. Mr. Madison had three paralytic strokes within a few years but had so far recovered from them as to be able to be about the streets, though incapacitated for active labor. He had not been feeling well for the last two weeks, showing symptoms of a dropsical trouble.

Mr. Madison had been a resident of this village for some twenty years, coming here from East Bloomfield. He served for several years as a town constable and it is said of him that he was once elected to that office by the largest majority ever given to a candidate for town office. In politics he was a Republican, as are so many of his race.

He is survived by his wife [Julia E. Van Horn Madison] and one son Chester, who resides at the family home. The funeral services will be held from the house Saturday afternoon at 3 o'clock, the Rev. E. [Edwin] P. Wood, pastor of St. Paul's Universalist church, officiating.
