Theron F. Manning

Theron F. Manning of Oneonta died at his home in that city at about nine o'clock on Wednesday morning. Though for a long time his health had not been of the best, he had failed more rapidly since early July and for the past seven weeks he had been confined to the bed. His death was from serious intestinal and stomach trouble.

The deceased was born May 15, 1852 in the town of Milford, and was a son of Joseph and Helen (Babcock) Manning. Practically all of his early life was spent in that township. He was married December 31, 1872 to Miss Jennie Gurney of Portlandville. He was by occupation a shoemaker, and an excellent workman. He moved to Oneonta about twenty-five years ago and for a time was a partner of the late J. K. Cutler. Afterwards he carried on business in the shoe stores of George Kirkland and Leslie Gardner, his shop being in the latter's store to the time of his death.

The funeral services will be held from his late home at 1 p.m. on Friday. The Rev. Charles Kramer of the Universalist church at Cooperstown will officiate and burial will be in Pine Grove cemetery at Portlandville. The Masonic burial service will be given at the house by the Oneonta lodge, of which he was formerly master.

The surviving members of his immediate family are his wife above named, two sisters, Miss Lula Manning of Cohoes and Mrs. W. E. Ackart of Troy, and one brother, Willis H. Manning of Cohoes. To these, and in particular to the devoted wife of but a little less than half a century, the heartfelt sympathy of all will be extended.
