OBITUARY

D.D.T. Marshall died at Trenton Falls, N.Y., his birthplace, last Sunday of pneumonia, in his seventy-eighth year. Of late years Mr. Marshall took no active part in politics or business, but previous to and during the war he was a staunch abolitionist. Horace Greeley was numbered among his most intimate friends. He held the Presidency of the Homeopathic Life Insurance Company for a number of years, and during the war he was Naval Storekeeper at the Brooklyn Navy Yard. He was Excise Commissioner in this city during Mayor Havemeyer's term. Mr. Marshall was connected as an officer and member with Dr. [Edwin] Chapin's Church of the Divine Paternity [Fourth Universalist Society of the City of New York] for a number of years, and was one of the founders of the Chapin Home for the Aged and Infirm. A widow and two daughters survive him. His funeral will be attended from the Church of the Divine Paternity, Fifth-avenue and Forty-fifth-street, tomorrow at 11 A.M. Interment will take place in Greenwood.
