EDGAR (TED) MATHER

Edgar (Ted) Mather, aged 65, was born in Syracuse, son of the late James and Adeline Barnes Mather, but had resided for several years in New Haven.

He was a salesman for the Lipe Rollway Co., in Syracuse and was a member of the Syracuse Universalist Church.

He was a member of the (Konosioni?) Lodge, F&AM, of Syracuse and the Tigris Temple in Syracuse, and the American Legion of New Haven.

Surviving him are a sister, Mrs. W A. Bower of Newark, N.J., and a brother, C. R. Marsh of Skaneateles.

Arrangements here were in charge of the Gibbs Funeral Home, where the body lay in state until Saturday, when it was removed to the Greenleaf Funeral Home in Syracuse, where services were held Sunday at 2:30 p.m., with the Rev. Ellsworth C. Reamon, pastor of the Universalist Church officiating. Burial was in Highland Cemetery, Marcellus.

Mr. Mather was killed instantly Wednesday afternoon November 27th, in a two car collision on Route 104, between Mexico and New Haven.

Mather was traveling east en route home from work in Syracuse at the Rollway Bearing Co., when his car skidded on a hill and was struck broadside by a station wagon carrying the Oswego trio, who were homeward bound from a work project at Pulaski.

The impact hurled both machines off the highway on the north side of the road. Both victims were thrown to the snow-covered ground.
