Obituary.

Thomas McAdam, son of the late Judge David McAdam, died yesterday morning at the Hotel San Remo after an illness of two hours. He and Mrs. McAdam had been to witness the drill of the Signal Corps Thursday night and when he reached his apartment was feeling perfectly well. At 4 o'clock, however, he awakened and complained that his heart troubled him. He would not send for a physician at once, and when his wife finally prevailed upon him to call a doctor it was too late. He died before the doctor reached him. Neuralgia of the heart was the cause of death. Mr. McAdam had practiced law in this city since 1887, when he was graduated from the Columbia Law School. He was at one time one of the firm of Taylor, Hamlin, McAdam & Walsh, and upon the dissolution of the firm at the death of the senior partner several years ago became the trial lawyer of the Cooperative Law Company of (44?) Court street, Brooklyn. Funeral services will be held at the San Remo Sunday afternoon at 4 o'clock by the Rev. Dr. Hall of the Church of the Divine Paternity [Fourth Universalist]. Mr. McAdam leaves a widow and one son, besides his mother and three brothers. He was born in this city April 23, 1863, and was married April 20, 1857, to Sarah Blair.
