Albert Miller Buried

FULTON, Dec. 14.—The funeral of Albert Miller was held yesterday afternoon. He died after much suffering Tuesday night at his home in lower Oswego Falls. He was in the Army during the War of the Rebellion and was in the Twenty-fourth New York Cavalry. He was a prisoner in Andersonville, where he suffered injuries to his constitution which never left him. He was held in high esteem by his comrades and was followed to his last resting place by nearly every member of the Schenck G.A.R. Post, some of whom came long distances to be present. The service was held at the house and the interment was at Mount Adah Cemetery. Rev. James Vincent, D.D., pastor of the Universalist Church, officiated.
