Edward Miller

FORT PLAIN, Sept. 25.—Edward Miller, aged 57 years, died Sunday at his home in this village. Mr. Miller had been in poor health for a long time. In early life he lived in Nelliston and was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Garrett Miller. Most of his life, however, was spent in Fort Plain. For many years he worked at the Fort Plain Spring and Axle works and followed the trade of spring grinding. When the shops moved to Chicago Heights, Ill., he remained here and followed different vocations and for a long time was employed as a lock-tender on the Erie Canal. Of late he had been employed by V.O. Garlock. In politics Mr. Miller was a staunch Republican. He is survived by his wife, two daughters, Mrs. Edward Harbster of this village and Mrs. Arthur Williams of Mohawk; one sister, Mrs. Albert D. Sheffield of Nelliston; one brother, Elmer Miller, who resides near Rochester; also six grandchildren. The funeral will be held at the Catherine Nellis Memorial chapel Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, the Rev. Herbert Frank Moulton, D.D., pastor of the Universalist church officiating. The interment will be made in the Fort Plain cemetery.
