MRS ELIZABETH MILLIGAN

Woman Identified with Educational and Suffrage Movements Dies

Mrs. Elizabeth Milligan, of No. 51 Chandler street, died yesterday afternoon after an illness of nearly three months. She was at one time an active member of the Woman Suffrage Association, the Saturday Club and a charter member and president of the Women's Educational and Industrial Union. She was a member of First Universalist Church and until last fall she was a regular attendant of the Wooden class.

She leaves a daughter, Mrs. C. [Clyde] B. Harris; a son, Frederick C. Milligan; and three grandchildren, Ralph A. Milligan, Donald W. Harris and Andrew P. Harris. The funeral will take place from the home at 2 o'clock Tuesday afternoon. Burial, which will be private, will be made in the family lot in Riverside cemetery.
