George B. Montgomery  
Son of the late Rev. Dr. Montgomery Died Last Night

George B. Montgomery died at 6 o'clock last evening at his residence, No. 199 Monroe avenue. Mr. Montgomery was the son of Rev. Dr. George W. Montgomery, who died on the 17th of this month. He was born in this city on the 18th of June, 1848, attended Nos. 11 and 12 schools, and graduated from the Free Academy at the age of 18.

Immediately after this he entered the employment of the First National Bank; after this he went to the Errickson, Jennings & Co. bank, where he remained a number of years, and then accepted a position in the Mechanics' Savings Bank, where he successively held the positions of teller, cashier and mortgage clerk.

For several years he had been in failing health, but without alarming symptoms, until Sunday, the 10th inst., when he suffered an attack of apoplexy on the street, after paying his daily visit to his father, and from that attack he never fully regained consciousness.

He was a consistent member of the First Universalist Church, of which his father was the founder, and through all his years of manhood was an active factor in that body. He leaves a wife [Belle S. Macomber, whom he married in Rochester on Oct. 8, 1872] and two daughters to mourn his loss.
