In this city, October 10, Mrs. JANE MORRILL, aged 37 years. By this sudden and unexpected dispensation of Divine Providence, Br. Morrill is bereaved of a kind and amiable companion, and three children, one of whom is an infant, of a tender and affectionate mother. The deceased, as we learn, seems to have had a presentiment of her immediate death. A few days before she died, and while apparently in health, she sat down and wrote a letter to her husband, who was in Lockport on business, and detained longer than he expected, that she had been to the gate in the door-yard and returned for the last time, and that she should [would] never see him again in this world; and this proved but too true... Funeral services were attended by the writer, on the 12th inst.
