DEATHS.

In Stratford, Montgomery county, December 1st, Mr. EDWARD W. MOSHER, only son of Abiather Mosher, Esq., aged about 25 years. The deceased had been, for about two years pervious to his death, afflicted with frequent and excessive bleeding at the nose, which complaint at last terminated his mortal existence. He has left a companion, to whom he was united last March¹, who deeply feels her loss, and an aged father and mother, two sisters, and many other relatives to mourn their loss. But they mourn not as do many, for being believers in the resurrection of a ransomed world to holiness and happiness, they expect to meet again where sorrow will never come, and they shall part no more. The funeral was attended on the 3d, and a discourse delivered by the writer to a large and apparently deeply interested congregation, composed of different denominations of Christians; but the Baptists were the most numerous, among which was their preacher, who declined taking any part in the services of the occasion, for reasons best known to himself.
