DEATHS

In Scipio, Cayuga co., N.Y., on the 20th August last, Mrs. CHARLOTTE NICHOLLS, wife of Frederick Nicholls, and daughter of William Tabor, Esq., aged 37 years. Mrs. N. was a person of unblemished character, and she possessed that kindness of disposition—that gentleness and affectionate regard for the welfare and happiness of others—which endeared her to all with whom she was acquainted. She was a dutiful child, a faithful and loving companion, and a true, warm-hearted, devoted friend. In religion, she was a Universalist. She believed in the paternity of God, in the divine efficiency of Gospel truth, and the final redemption of the world. And although she was called away suddenly and unexpectedly, yet she was not unprepared—she had no fears of death—for she trusted in a Father whose grace is sufficient for us at all times. Her funeral was attended on the 22d, and a discourse preached to a large congregation of sympathizing friends and neighbors, by the writer. May the consolations of the christian message be with the parents, brothers and sisters [including Silence], who are by this providence, so deeply and painfully afflicted.
