SYLVESTER G. NOTT

Sylvester G. Nott died at the residence of his daughter, Mrs. W.R. Roach, in Hart, Mich., Sunday morning, Jan. 31.

Mr. Nott went to Hart about seven years ago and had since made his home with his son, B. C. Nott and daughter, Mrs. Roach.

He was very active in the poultry business and bred many fine chickens and won many prizes at all the poultry shows where he exhibited. He was well known by many people in the village of Hart for his activity along these and other lines, and he continued in the poultry business until about two years ago, when his health failed. Mr. Nott had always followed commercial pursuits and had been actively engaged in business all his life. He became a Mason in 1855 and was a Knight Templar, belonging to the Commandery in Watertown, N.Y. He was a life long Universalist and affiliated with the Pullman Memorial church in Albion, N.Y.

For the last fifteen months he had been confined to his room. Mr. Nott was a highly cultured gentleman. He was born in St. Lawrence co., N.Y. in 1836. He was the son of Reuben and Olive Nott. In 1864 he was married to Miss Emma P. Cleveland, daughter of James M. Cleveland of Adams, N.Y., Mrs. Nott having died in Albion, N.Y. in the year 1897.

Mr. Nott is survived by two sons and three daughters, Carl C Nott of Memphis, Tenn.; Mrs. C. A. Gaudier of New York city; Mrs. W. R. Roach, B. C. Nott and Miss Harriet Nott of Hart, Mich.

After a private service the family left Hart Tuesday morning, Feb. 2, with the remains. Interment in Elmwood Cemetery in Adams.

The many friends of Mr. Nott will remember him as a very courteous, pleasant gentleman, with a most kindly disposition and a pleasant word for all. Although he has not been able to get around town very much for the last two years, the friends of the family will miss him very much.
