LESTER NUGENT

Brownville, April 24.—Lester Nugent, well known fisherman and farmer of Pillar Point, died at 1 this morning at the home of his daughter, Mrs. James O. Chapman, in the town of Brownville, following a long illness resulting from advanced years, aged 84 years, eight months and 25 days.

He was born in the town of Rutland, but had lived the greater part of his life in Pillar Point where he conducted a small farm for many years. He engaged in fishing extensively and for many years served as guide to fishing parties. Three years ago he gave up active occupation and went to live with his sister [daughter] in the town of Brownville, where he had since resided.

He leaves three daughters, Mrs. Sarah I. Burlingame of Dexter, Mrs. Carrie Goodfriend of Watertown, and Mrs. [Hattie] Chapman of the town of Brownville, and two sons, Charles L. Nugent of Henryetta, Ola., and Edward R. Nugent of Forsyth, Montana.

The funeral will be held from the Chapman home at 10 Saturday morning, Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed, pastor of All Souls Universalist church, Watertown, officiating. Interment will be made in the family plot in the cemetery at Point Salubrious.
