MRS. ELLA NUTTING DIES FOLLOWING LONG ILLNESS WIFE OF JOSEPH H. NUTTING HAD BEEN SICK ABOUT SIX YEARS

Mrs. Ella May Lawton Nutting, aged 52 years, wife of Joseph H. Nutting, died about 11:20 Saturday night at the family residence, 826 Boyd street, following a long illness. Mrs. Nutting had been in failing health for about six years and her condition had been critical for several days.

Her son, Paul Joseph Nutting, of Toledo, O., who was notified of her condition, arrived home Friday and was at his mother's bedside at the time of her death.

Mrs. Nutting was born in Sacket's Harbor, Dec. 2, 1868, daughter of the late Theodore D. and Adelia Lawton. She spent the greater part of her life in Watertown, having moved here with her parents when she was a child.
