GIRL DIES OF TUBERCULOSIS

Dexter, Dec. 11.—Miss Mildred A. Nutting, aged 25 years and six months, died at the home of her aunt, Mrs. S. L. [Mary] Greene, this morning. Miss Nutting had always resided in Dexter and was a graduate of the Dexter High school and a member of the alumni association of the school. She had been employed as bookkeeper and stenographer for the Dexter Electric Light and Power Co. and the Warren Parchment Co. She had suffered from tuberculosis for the past year and was at Saranac Lake for ten months.

Miss Nutting is survived by her father, John J. Nutting of this place; one sister, Mrs. C. J. Sergent of Liverpool, N.Y., and two brothers, E. [G.: Grover] W. Nutting and M. D. [Milton Daniel] Nutting, both of this place.

Funeral services will be held from the home of Mrs. Greene Sunday afternoon at 1:30, Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed, pastor of the Universalist church officiating. Interment will be made in the Dexter cemetery.
