DIED.

George Osgoodby, one of the best known younger attorneys of Rochester, died at the Homeopathic hospital in that city, of pneumonia, on Friday, October 25th, and burial was made in Oakwood cemetery, Nunda, last Sunday.

Two services were held, the first at Jeffreys Chapel in Rochester, Saturday afternoon, which was attended by a large number of the leading attorneys and business men who had intimately known and become very fond of the young man during the two years of his practice in that city. Rev. Arthur W. Grose [pastor of the Universalist Church] conducted the services and paid a glowing tribute to the honor and success which had attended the deceased.

The other service was held at the residence of Melvin H. Osgoodby, the family homestead in Nunda, Sunday afternoon, Rev. M.K. Merwin and Rev. George R. Bernhard officiating, both of whom spoke feelingly of the high attainments and splendid character of the young attorney.

George Osgoodby was the son of Alfred Osgoodby and the late Florence Osgoodby and was born at Buffalo, being 27 years old at the time of his death. He commenced his education at the Nunda school and finished it at Andover, Princeton and the Albany Law School where he graduated with high honors, and was a member of Delta Chi fraternity.

During the past year he was actively interested in war work; he was a member of the Legal Advisory Board, and has rendered valuable services in the several Liberty Loan campaigns.
