David Ostrom

Fort Plain, March 5.—David Ostrom, aged 62 years, died yesterday morning at the Homeopathic hospital in Utica, where he had been undergoing treatment for lead poisoning for the past two weeks. The body was brought to his home in this village yesterday. Mr. Ostrom was born at Glenville, Schenectady county, and later located in Amsterdam. From Amsterdam he came to Fort Plain and has lived here for many years. He followed the trade of a plumber and was one of the best in the Mohawk valley. For many years he conducted a hardware store and plumbing business in Fort Plain, his store being located in the Glaessel block on Canal street. The business is now conducted by W.T. Linney. He was a member of Fort Plain lodge, No. 433, F. and A.M., and of Mohawk Valley lodge, No. 66, Knights of Pythias. Mr. Ostrom was popular with all with whom he came in contact. He was deeply interested in all things of local interest and was actively associated with them until his health failed. At one time he served the village as trustee, although as a rule he did not care to hold office. Mr. Ostrom was most optimistic and even in his last days had a cheery word for all, and his many friends will sincerely regret his death. He is survived by his wife, three daughters, Mrs. Lewis Birk and Miss Frances Ostrom of Fort Plain and Mrs. Waldo W. Brown of Rochester; one brother, and two sisters, Gerard Ostrom of Schenectady, and Mrs. T.H. Benton Crane and Mrs. John Blood, of Amsterdam. He was also a brother of the late Daniel Ostrom, of Amsterdam.
