DR. C. A. PALMER DIES; PHYSICIAN 22 YEARS

Dr. C. Alanson Palmer, 50 year old, for 22 years a medical practitioner in Brooklyn, died in the Passaic General Hospital at Passaic, N.J., yesterday, after a long illness. He had been suffering from pericarditis for some time and for the past three months had been in the hospital.

Dr. Palmer was born in Astoria, L.I., the son of Glenson and Louise Palmer. He received his schooling in the local educational institutions, graduating in medicine from New York University and the Baltimore Medical College. Until last March, when he made his home in Rutherford, N.J., he had for many years been a member of All Souls Universalist Church, Ocean and Ditmas Aves.

Dr. Palmer was a physician and surgeon in the United States Army transport service during the World War. He was a member of Hill Grove Lodge No. 540, F. & A. M., and of the Long-I Grotto. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Alice Packard Palmer, a daughter, Ruth A., a son, Edward A. Palmer, and his parents. The funeral services will be held at the residence of his parents, 591 Madison st., on Thursday evening at 8 o'clock. The interment will be in Cypress Hill Cemetery.
