MRS. MARY E. PARTELLO  
Former Resident of Watertown Dies in Camden

Camden, Jan. 24.—Yesterday morning at 8 occurred the death of Mrs. Mary E. Partello. She died at the home of her niece, Mrs. James Finch, on Union street. Mrs. Partello had been in poor health for several weeks and her sickness finally resulted in pneumonia, which caused her death. She was born in Charleston, Montgomery co. 79 years ago. She spent the greater part of her life in Watertown, coming to Camden about six years ago. She was married 50 years ago to Charles Partello of Utica. She was a member of the Universalist church of Watertown. Mrs. Partello's death will be mourned by hosts of friends. She is survived by several nephews and nieces. The funeral will be held Sunday afternoon at 4 at the home of Mrs. Finch on Union street. Monday morning the body will be taken to Fultonville for burial.

Charles Partello, her husband, who died here a number of years ago [in 1904], was for many years one of Watertown's leading hardware men, conducting a store in the Taggart block in this city. He retired from business a few years before his death.

They lived for many years in their home at 129 Academy street, now owned by Joseph (B\_\_?).
