DIED IN TEXAS

William Peacock Was a Former Well Known Auburn Business Man

William Peacock, formerly engaged in business in Auburn, died yesterday at an advanced age in Houston, Texas, where he has lived in retirement for many years. Mr. Peacock was well known here, having visited relatives every summer. Over 20 years ago he conducted a grocery concern here and later a furniture store in Dill Street. He then removed to Houston where he spent the remainder of his life. He leaves his widow, who was before her marriage Miss Lottie Fisher of Auburn, one son, William Peacock of Houston, a daughter, Mrs. Henry Rhodes of Houston, a sister, Mrs. G. M. Duryea of Owasco, a brother, Thomas Peacock of Auburn, and a half brother, John V. Peacock of Los Angeles, Cal. The remains will be sent here for burial in Soule Cemetery. Funeral arrangements are incomplete.
