Under its appropriate heading¹ will be found the death notice of Israel Peck, a widely known and (especially by those who knew him best) highly esteemed citizen of this village. During Mr. Peck's long residence here he ever proved one of Southold's most influential and public spirited citizens. To him the (village?) owes a large debt of gratitude—more than it has ever paid. His death calls forth expressions of regret on every hand. A few weeks since we gave the particulars of a recent injury which befell Mr. Peck in Virginia, from the effects of which he did not recover, although the disease which caused his sudden (d__?) and death, was pronounced heart disease. The funeral sermon was preached at his late residence on Wednesday by the Rev. Abram Conklin² [Universalist]; the attendance was large. The following friends from abroad were present: A. Jackson Peck and wife, of Port Chester, N.Y.; Henry Peck and Mrs. Wm. B. Peck of Greenwich, Ct.; Mrs. Mary D. Peck, of New York City; James Vail and wife and Mrs. J. M Edwards, of (?). The remains were interred yesterday (Thursday) in Willow Hill Cemetery.
