GUY PENIMAN¹, 70, DIES AT CARTHAGE
Prominent Retired Merchant Expires at His Home

Carthage, July 10.—Guy Peniman, prominent retired merchant, died today at his home in State street, aged nearly 70 years. The funeral will be held Monday afternoon at 2 (new time) from the home, Rev. G. D. [George Delbert] Walker [Universalist] officiating. Burial will be made at Riverside cemetery.

He was born in October, 1860, in the town of Wilna, the son of Guy E. and Madeline Smith Peniman. He married Miss Cornelia Colburn, 48 years ago. For about ten years they lived on a farm in Wilna, moving to this village 38 years ago. Mr. Peniman conducted a harness store, farmer's shed and delivery system. He had a wide acquaintance among traveling men. Five years ago he sold the business to C. E. VanSlyke & Son who have since conducted it. Mr. Peniman was a member of the Foresters and a Republican in politics.

Surviving are the widow and two children, Mrs. E. H. Wager and Eber G. Peniman of Schenectady; three grandchildren, Glenn and Guy Peniman and Guy Wager of Schenectady.
