Mrs. Mary M. Pickard, age 55 years, died Friday morning, May 27th, at her home in Brookman's Corners after an illness of several weeks, due to an abscess. She was a daughter of the late Joseph and Margaret Casler Dillenback and was born in Brookman's Corners, July 28, 1854. She was united in marriage July 18, 1877 to Martin A. Pickard, who died June 25, 1895.

All her life had been passed in the vicinity of Brookman's Corners and she was well and favorably known by all residents of that section. Mrs. Pickard was a true and devoted mother and gave to her family every care and consideration possible and this same trait had endeared her to those of her family circle also won the admiration of her every acquaintance. She was agreeable, considerate and kind-hearted to all and none ever made a worthy appeal to her who was not given deserved attention. She was affiliated with the Universalist church of Fort Plain and devoted to its cause. Mrs. Pickard is survived by a brother, Solomon Dillenback, one son, Ralph H. Pickard, and two grandchildren, Ruth M. and Martin A. Pickard, all of Brookman's Corners. The funeral was held Monday afternoon, May 30th, at her late residence at 1 o'clock, the Rev. H. W. Carr of South Framingham, Mass. [a former minister] officiating. Interment was made in the Fort Plain cemetery.
