ALEXANDER HUBBARD POLLEY
Native of Rochester and Printer Dies in Minneapolis

Alexander Hubbard Polley, who died last Sunday in Minneapolis, was the son of Mr. and Mrs. George W. [Frances] Polley, old residents of the Fourth Ward, where he was born at No. 10 James street. He attended No. 12 school and he was a member of the old Universalist Church Sunday-school and congregation.

Early in his teens, young Polley took up printing and was a compositor on the Union and Advertiser for many years under the late A. M. Flannery. Leaving Rochester in the early (80s?), he made his home in Minneapolis. He was in the real estate business.

Mr. Polley leaves his wife [Lillian]; his mother, Mrs. Frances Polley, aged 95 years; a sister-in-law, Mrs. Elizabeth Hannan, of Rutgers street; a niece, Mrs. Frances Hannan Smith, a daughter of John W. Hannan, a half-brother. Interment was in Minneapolis, where Mr. Polley had been a member of the Masonic bodies.
