In East Rush, Monroe co. N.Y., Oct. 12, STEWART PORTER, aged 67. Mr. Porter was born in Hoosick, N.Y., but from early youth to the day of his death he was a citizen of Rush, and occupied an honorable and elevated position in that community... He was for years a member of the Universalist Society in North Bloomfield, and honored his profession by commendable zeal. But the good man is gone and his memory is sweet to those who regret his departure. He died suddenly of a disease of the heart, making no complaint til the moment of his death, which was as peaceful to himself as it was unexpected to his friends. Funeral services were observed in honor of his memory on Saturday the 14th, in the Methodist church in East Rush. Remarks were made from the text—"There shall be no more death," by Rev. C[harles] Hammond, and the usual address to the family and friends by Rev. G[eorge] W. Gage.
