In this city, on the 20th inst., Mrs. Sarah, wife of John Post, aged 42 years. Sister Post had, for many years, been a firm believer in the doctrine of Universalism. In this faith she had lived and died. The disease which terminated in her death was consumption. It was our privilege to visit her several times during her sickness, and we always found her resigned, and comforted by her faith in the Gospel. She spoke freely of her approaching dissolution, and seemed willing to go, when God should [would] call her away. And when the solemn hour came she called her companion and children to her bedside, and, taking each by the hand, bade them her last farewell, and soon fell asleep in Jesus. Sister Post had many warm friends in this city, and was deservedly esteemed by all her acquaintances. But we sympathize with the mourning family, and particularly with Br. Post who has an interesting group of children that need a mother's care and counsel.

The funeral was attended on the 22d inst. at her residence by an unusually large number of friends, and we endeavored to comfort them with the comfort wherewith we are comforted of God. Her remains were then conveyed to Mt. Hope for interment.
