BURIAL OF MRS. PULLMAN Her Remains Laid in the Family Plot in the Cemetery at Albion

The remains of Mrs. Emily C. Pullman¹, the aged mother of George M. Pullman of palace-car fame, arrived in Albion yesterday morning at 11:40 o'clock, accompanied by a party of relatives and friends who occupied two special coaches. The party was composed of the Rev. R. H. [Royal Henry] Pullman of Baltimore, Md., Mr. and Mrs. George M. Pullman, A. B. Pullman, Miss Pullman, Miss Harriet Pullman, W. Sanger Pullman, Fred A. Pullman, Mr. and Mrs. C. L. Pullman, Mr. and Mrs. W. C. Pullman, Miss Emma Pullman and Miss Emily Stuart, all of Chicago; the Rev. and Mrs. James M. Pullman of Lynn, Mass.; P. J. Cawlan of San Francisco and Mr. and Mrs. W. F. Fluhrer, Helen Pullman Fluhrer, Minton Fluhrer, Lewis Pullman Fluhrer, Mr. and Mrs. George West, Miss Bertha West, and Stuart Pullman West of New-York.

Carriages were taken from the station and the party proceeded to Mount Albion, where the burial took place in the family plot. The officiating clergyman was the Rev. Dr. Gunnison of Worcester, Mass., who was assisted by the Rev. Dr. [Asa] Saxe of Rochester. The pallbearers were the six grandsons of the deceased: George M. Pullman, Jr., Fred A. Pullman, W. Sanger Pullman, Stuart Wess, W. C. Pullman and Mimon Fluhrer. Upon the return of the party from the cemetery the old home was visited, when the party again returned to their cars, which left on the 4:30 train for New-York.
