Died.

RADWAY—In Canton, near Crary's Mills, Nov. 9, of consumption, Mr. Richard Radway, a native of England, but for forty years a resident of this county, aged seventy-three years.

Richard Radway was born in Chedworth, England, the youngest of a family of eleven children. Some of his elder brothers came to this country, and when a young man he followed them thither, walking through the forest from Lake Champlain to Canton, St. Lawrence county, New York, where he cleared a farm that is still in the possession of the family. In his native country he had learned the trades of painter and plumber, and he followed it [sic] in this country, in addition to his agricultural occupation. Mr. Radway was a Republican in politics. He was, in early life, a communicant of the church of England, afterward, in this country, a member of the Universalist Church.

He married Mary Ann, daughter of Solomon and Ann (Wells) Squires, who came from Vermont to St. Lawrence county, among the early settlers. Children of Mr. and Mrs. Radway: 1. Charles W., 2. William O., born November 23, 1853, now living on the old homestead at Canton, 3. Anna, married Marshall Giffen, and had two children, Richard, deceased, and Mary.
